Health services in Oxfordshire

Please help Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust to share the following information about the availability of health services in the county.

A&E: The Emergency Departments at the John Radcliffe and Horton General Hospitals are still open 24/7 to anyone who becomes ill with serious health conditions including stroke, heart conditions, difficulty breathing, unconsciousness, or heavy bleeding. People should be reassured that systems are in place to triage patients with suspected COVID-19, so everyone who comes to our hospitals will be treated in a safe manner. For other worrying health concerns that are not an emergency please contact your GP practice; they are open and will be able to give advice and support over the phone in the first instance. The national advice for people who think they may have COVID-19 is to visit NHS 111 online and self-isolate for seven days. We urge people to please seek help if you need it. Avoiding medical care can lead to reduced recovery rates, and even prove fatal.

Maternity services: we would like to reassure pregnant women our maternity service is still open 24/7 for births, urgent care, and clinical advice during the coronavirus pandemic. There are steps to keep staff and expectant mothers safe – this includes carrying out some appointments by telephone or videos. We are running our usual high risk antenatal clinics in the John Radcliffe and Horton General Hospitals and the ultrasound departments at both hospitals are operating. Midwives are still able to see women regularly in pregnancy including in Banbury, Chipping Norton, Wantage and Wallingford, as well as in Oxford. Antenatal classes are not running in person at present, however the midwifery teams are running childbirth and 'Ask the Midwife' sessions using Facebook live from their Oxfordshire Maternity Voices Partnership page.
