Elections Update

There are three sets of elections taking place on 6 May across the whole of Cherwell District:

- Cherwell District Council (one seat in each ward plus two by-elections)
- Oxfordshire County Council (all seats)
- Police and Crime Commissioner

Additionally, there are scheduled elections in a third of Cherwell parishes, plus the Weston on the Green Neighbourhood Plan referendum.

The deadline to register to vote is 11.59pm, Monday 19 April (today), and the postal vote deadline is 5pm, Tuesday 20 April. Anyone who wants to vote by proxy must apply by 5pm on Thursday 27 April.

The polls will be open on Thursday 6 May from 7am to 10pm. Verification of all ballot papers will take place on Friday 7 May at Spiceball Leisure Centre. The count for all of the local elections will be on Sunday 9 May, and the count for the PCC election will be on Monday 10 May.

Due to COVID-secure measures, attendance at the verification and counts will be restricted (details will be provided to candidates and agents) and will take much longer than usual.

Covid-19 Local Infection Rates and Testing

In Cherwell, there were 22 new cases in the seven days up to 09 April, (down from 28 the previous week), which is equivalent to a weekly rate of 14.6 per 100,000 residents. 2 of these new cases were in people over the age of 60 (down from 3 the previous week). You can access a <u>COVID-19 dashboard</u> on the county council's website for daily COVID-19 statistics.

If you have COVID-19 symptoms, you must self-isolate immediately and <u>book a</u> <u>symptomatic (PCR) test</u> at one of Oxfordshire's five symptomatic testing sites as soon as possible. Do not attend a symptom-free site or use a lateral flow device. More information is available on OCC's <u>symptom testing pages</u>.

If you don't have symptoms, you can book free rapid lateral flow device (LFD) tests at one of four symptom-free sites across the county, access tests through your workplace or school, collect home test kits from any local testing site (symptomatic or symptom-free) in Oxfordshire, or order test kits for home delivery. All the <u>symptom-free testing information</u> is available on the county council's website.

Village Halls & Green Spaces – Updated Guidance

Last week the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) updated the guidance for those managing community centres, village halls and other community facilities on safely re-opening to reflect changes to national lockdown rules which came into effect on 12 April. Also published (by DEFRA) was updated guidance on green spaces (including sports facilities and countryside access).
